

# CHAIRMAN'S MESSAGE

## Greetings from Polombo!

he year 2008 must be one of the most eventful years for the Asia-Pacific region. A growing number of natural disasters had caused huge damages to the region. Some of these were deadly devastating, such as



This year too is a very eventful year for APAFRI. After the hectic first-half of the year as was reported in the previous issue of our newsletter, the secondhalf was as hectic. APAFRI organized half-a-dozen meetings and workshops during this period, averaging one per month. The biggest event was the Asia Pacific Forest Health Workshop in Kuala Lumpur, 1–3 December. The two-and-a-half-day workshop was funded by the contributions of Korea Forest Research Institute to the International Union Forest Research Organizations APAFRI, the Asia-Pacific chapter of IUFRO, was given the task of organizing this event together with the Asia Pacific Forest Invasive Species Network (APFISN). The workshop attracted 54 participants from 18 countries. These included representatives of a number of international and regional organizations, programmes, networks and projects dealing with invasive species and forest health, as well as, individuals working in policy, research and operations related to forest pests and diseases, environmental services, and forest management from the Asia and the Pacific region. APAFRI had



also assisted FAO in organizing two meetings: one on forest genetic resources in Kuala Lumpur in October, and another one on forest fire management in Pekanbaru, Indonesia, in November. Details of these and other events of APAFRI during the year can be found on our website. We have also produced compact discs for many of these events, which are available on request.

A number of member institutions, including Forest Research Institute Malaysia (FRIM), have new heads during the year. Dr Abdul Razak Mohd Ali, the Immediate Past Chairman of APAFRI Executive Committee, and the Director General of FRIM, had retired from Malaysian Civil Service in late April. On behalf of APAFRI, I wish to convey our most sincere gratitude to him for the numerous contributions to APAFRI which had propelled APAFRI to its current status. When he was elected chairman of APAFRI Executive Committee in 2000, he had convinced the FRIM Board to host APAFRI Secretariat in the FRIM campus. He had again, in 2006, persuaded the FRIM Board to continue this commitment of hosting APAFRI Secretariat even though he was no longer the Chairman, as he had served the maximum two terms of six years. FRIM's outlay in hosting APAFRI Secretariat is quite substantial in financial terms. Besides providing a fairly large office space and Internet connections, FRIM had also assigned Dr Sim Heok-Choh, a senior researcher to serve as the Secretariat's full time Executive Director, together with a personnel assistant, since 2002.

Dr Daniel Baskaran, APAFRI's Executive Secretary since 2000, had also just submitted his resignation to me. He is leaving FRIM to join a private conservation foundation. Daniel is well known to be a highly charismatic person, always full of energy. His excellent skill in conducting meetings and moderating discussions had made many a meeting or workshop interesting and fruitful. While wishing him every success in his new endeavour,

we would certainly miss his service which had guided APAFRI all these years. With Daniel's resignation, I have suggested, and got the endorsement from the Executive Committee, that Dr Sim Heok-Choh, the current Executive Director, be designated as the Executive Secretary of APAFRI. This would be a temporary measure till the next General Assembly due in 2009. The Director General of FRIM, in assuring FRIM's continued commitment to host APAFRI Secretariat, had previously mentioned about assigning another officer from FRIM to assist Dr Sim. This person could eventually takeover the responsibilities of Executive Director. This is also part of a succession plan to ensure the long term sustainability of APAFRI.

APAFRI's next General Assembly, the fifth since its establishment in 1995, is due in 2009. The Forestry Research and Development Agency of

Indonesia (FORDA) has earlier consented to host this event. To attract better attendance at the General Assembly, it would be held together with a regional conference. The Secretariat had already initiated discussion with FORDA on the tentative theme of the conference and other details. The discussions would be intensified during the months to come, and more information would be made available well in advance to allow members to plan to attend this important event.

I would like to end this message wishing you all a VERY HAPPY, HEALTHY AND PROPEROUS 2009.

### **FORESTRY RESEARCH AWARD 2009**

his award is presented to a young researcher who has made outstanding contributions in forestry research and development. It is given once every three years and presented in conjunction with the APAFRI General Assembly. The next General Assembly, to be convened in 2009, will present the award consisting of a specially designed plaque and a citation. The recipient will also be fully supported to attend the award presentation ceremony and the General Assembly. Dr. Rao, in whose honour the award is named, was one of the outstanding foresters in the Asia Pacific region. He contributed significantly to the promotion of forestry research, particularly research related to poverty alleviation, sustainable resource development and the needs of young researchers. He had also mooted the idea of setting up APAFRI. The first Dr. Y.S. Rao Forestry Research Award was presented in 2000.

The award went to Dr. Wu Bo, Associate Professor at the Research Institute of Forestry (RIF), Chinese Academy of Forestry (CAF), Beijing, in recognition of his outstanding research on desertification. The recipient of the reward given out the second time in 2003 was Dr Ashok Kumar, Scientist and Head, Division of Tree Improvement and Propagation, Rain Forest Research Institute, Jorhat, Assam, India. Dr Ashok Kumar has made considerable contributions in various areas ranging from forest genetics, genetic improvement, tree improvement to tissue culture. The APAFRI Secretariat is now calling for nominations for the 2009 award. Eligibility is limited to researchers from APAFRI member institutions, and nominations are to be submitted by member institutions. There is no specific nomination form, but applicant must send in short curriculum vitae accompanied by a compilation of research papers or reports. Deadline for submission is 30 April 2009.

#### THE FIFTH APAFRI

#### **GENERAL ASSEMBLY**

The once-in-three-year APAFRI General Assembly is due in 2009. This shall be the fifth since its establishment in 1995.

Article X and XI of the APAFRI Constitution provide guidelines for conducting the General Assembly:

#### **ARTICLE X**

#### The General Assembly

General Assembly of the Association shall be represented by one delegate from each member institution.

The General Assembly shall meet once every three years after the close of the financial year but not later than the month of April on a date and at a time and place to be decided by the Executive Committee.

All decisions shall be taken by a simple majority vote. In the case of equality of votes, the Chairperson shall have a casting vote

The quorum for the General Assembly shall be 33% of the membership.

If half an hour after the time appointed for the meeting of the General Assembly a quorum is not present, the members present shall have the power to proceed with the business of the day but they shall not have the power to alter the constitution of the Association or make decisions affecting the whole membership.

Notice of meeting together with an agenda, minutes of the

previous General Assembly and an audited account of the Association shall be forwarded to the members at least 30 days before of the General Assembly.

An Extraordinary General Assembly may be convened whenever the Executive Committee deems it necessary or at the joint request in writing of not less than 1/5 of the members, stating the objects and reason for such a meeting.

Notice and agenda for an extraordinary General Assembly shall be forwarded by the Executive Secretary to all members at least 15 days before the date fixed for the meeting.

The provisions regarding quorum and postponement of the triennial General Assembly shall also apply to an Extraordinary General Assembly but with the proviso that if no quorum is present after half an hour from the time appointed for the Extraordinary General Assembly requisitioned by the members, the meeting shall be cancelled, no extraordinary General Assembly shall be requisitioned for the same purpose until after the lapse of at least six months from the date thereof.

#### **ARTICLE XI**

#### **Duties of the General Assembly**

The General Assembly shall determine: The policy of the Association; Review and endorse the programme of work and budget prepared by the Executive Committee; Review progress;

Exercise other powers conferred upon it by the constitution.

The General Assembly shall elect the Executive Committee and appoint auditors.

As the last General Assembly was convened in July 2006 the next one, the Fifth General Assembly, should be held not earlier than July 2009. The Forestry Research and Development Agency of Indonesia (FORDA) has earlier consented to host this event. Traditionally, the General Assembly would be held in association with a major regional event to attract the attendance of representatives from member institutions.

More information would be made available well in advance to allow members to plan to attend this important event.

### **Daniel Baskaran is leaving APAFRI.....**

Dr Daniel Baskaran, APAFRI's Executive Secretary since 2000, is leaving FRIM to join a private conservation foundation, and has decided to discontinue his service as the Executive Secretary of APAFRI. While wishing him every success in his new endeavour, we would certainly miss his service which had guided APAFRI all these years.

With Daniel's resignation, the Executive Committee has designated Dr Sim Heok-Choh, the current Executive Director, as the Executive Secretary of APAFRI, effective 1 January 2009.
